AND WHEREAS: the existing Floodplain Mapping Program Design Brief (including Mapping) was developed in 1990 and 1991 for the Salmon River, etc. (prepared for the Province of British Columbia), is out of date and site conditions and hydrology may have changed significantly since then;

AND WHEREAS: Provincial legislation changes in 2003 – 2004 shifted most responsibilities for flood hazard management to local governments;

AND WHEREAS: the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of BC (APEGBC) issued Professional Practice Guidelines - Legislated Flood Assessments in a Changing Climate in BC in 2012;

AND WHEREAS: flooding in the Salmon River Valley, etc. may pose risks to Salmon Arm's vitality, infrastructure, environment, safety and public/private property interests;

AND WHEREAS: proposed development in the active portion of the Salmon River Delta must be carefully considered;

AND WHEREAS: the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure may be conducting a limited Salmon River hydraulic study in conjunction with the Salmon Arm West Highway/ Salmon River Bridge Project;

AND WHEREAS: potential Federal (e.g. National Disaster Mitigation Program) and/or Provincial grant funding for a FHRA may be contingent on the City having a 'shelf ready' FHRA project;

AND WHEREAS: the City does not presently have the capacity or expertise to prepare a 'shelf ready' Request for Proposals document for a FHRA;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: staff be directed to engage a consulting Professional Engineer or Professional Geoscientist to undertake a literature/ information review and prepare a Request for Proposals document to conduct a FHRA of the Salmon River Valley, etc. to address the following:

- Terms of Reference;
- Scope (e.g. geographic area {Salmon River Valley within/outside City boundaries, shoreline of Shuswap Lake, etc.}, flood frequency, stream flow, natural boundary establishment, climate change, forest cover, watershed hydrology, riverbed geomorphology, lake level, etc.);
- Consultation/Cooperation requirements with other agencies (eg. Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, Canadian Pacific Railway, etc.);
- Deliverables (eg. floodplain maps, flood proofing requirements to be incorporated into development bylaws, other administration tools, infrastructure recommendations to reduce vulnerability to flood impacts, other mitigation investment options, etc.); and
- Opinion of Probable Cost/ Budget;
